
The workbook plays an important complementary function. While the book written by Michael Rugube Ngwaru provides extensive information, the workbook assists in assimilating these principles by engaging our kids in a joyful and thought-provoking experience and naturally increasing receptivity and internalization of values. The abundance of activities shows sensitivity to the various learning styles of children. It aligns with the principle of using multiple strategies to pass on spiritual knowledge to the next generation (see Deut. 6:7-9).

Whereas the book can be read alone by kids with a certain level of reading proficiency, the workbook offers an interactive space for children and parents/educators. This material was designed for use in a family or as small-group activities. It helps foster relationships and strengthen bonds with our kids. Ultimately, this is the most decisive factor of discipleship, to "turn the hearts of the parents to their children, and the hearts of the children to their parents" (Mal. 4:6). The goal is not to challenge our children to come up with good answers to all the questions or to speedily complete the exercises but to foster quality time to build rapport and grow.
